FAQs

1. What is Worthington Together?

Worthington Together is a process to build on Vision Worthington and shape an action plan to guide where and how our city grows for years to come. It will address important topics such as neighborhoods and housing, commercial areas, parks, facilities, quality of life, transportation, sustainability, and related topics.

2. What is a comprehensive plan?

A comprehensive plan is a long-term guide for a community's future physical development addressing land use, housing, economics, parks, sustainability, transportation and related topics. The plan is used regularly to guide many City decisions, such as budgeting, infrastructure investments, zoning, and more.

3. Why do we need a new plan?

Worthington last completed a full update of the Comprehensive Plan in 2005. Since then, portions of the plan have been revised, and more narrowly focused plans have been adopted (e.g., Northeast Area Plan, Wilson Bridge Corridor Study, Bicycle & Pedestrian Master Plan, Parks Master Plan).

4. How does the comprehensive plan relate to Vision Worthington?

Vision Worthington was a community visioning effort that resulted in the adoption of seven vision areas in March 2021. The visions highlight the community's values and describe the community's desired future. The Comprehensive Plan should align with Vision Worthington with actionable recommendations focused on the community's physical development.

5. What is the Community Committee and how were members selected?

The Community Committee is a diverse group of 18 community members appointed by City Council to provide guidance and direction regarding the plan process and substance. The committee members were either nominated or selected through an open application process that yielded many talented, passionate, and qualified individuals. The committee members are collectively representative of many interests, geographic areas, professions, and demographics of the city's population.

6. Are there other opportunities for the community to get involved?

Three distinct rounds of community input with in-person events and online activities are planned. The first round (The Launch) took place from June through August 2025, the second round will take place in late 2025, and the third round will take place in early 2026 prior to the plan's completion.
